Into the Future – 3 Listening Exercise

In Bishop Peter's Pastoral Letter on Advent Sunday he spoke of meetings in the New Year to consider the updated pastoral plan. Dates and venues for those six open meetings are now established, they are Saturdays: 3rd February 10.30am to 12noon -Welshpool; and 2.30pm to 4.00pm - Wrexham; 24th February 2.30pm to 4.00pm -Rhyl; 2nd March 10.30am to 12noon -Llandudno; and 2.30pm to 4.00pm -Porthmadog; 9th March 2.30pm to 4.00pm -Buckley. Each meeting will have the same format: Formal and silent prayer; Presentation from Bp. Peter; opportunity for opinions, comments and suggestions from those present (maximum 3 minutes, please); Closing Prayer. Written (maximum 250words please) submissions can also be made – anonymous comments will not be considered. Parish Census

Much has happened and changed over the last few years and we no longer have an accurate record of who we are as a Parish.

Families may leave or arrive, parishioners' circumstances may change leading to changes of address, for example, people moving in with relatives, care homes, sheltered accommodation; our younger parishioners leaving as they find work or move elsewhere - there are many reasons why our make-up changes and is constantly changing.

We're looking at carrying out a census to bring us up to date. A census would ask for a basic set of information such as names, addresses and contact details of those in your household who are members of our Parish.

It will give us a better understanding of the make-up of parishioners and this will also help give the Parish direction in how and what we do to meet our spiritual and pastoral needs. The Parish is our faith community and is served by many faithful and generous individuals, couples and families. To support the Parish's mission it would be really helpful to also understand everything that you do in the service of our community, and all that you could do to lend a helping hand. To this end, we would like to produce a further form that will gather this information and set us on a path for the future development of the Parish.

We're looking, too, to hold a Parish Meeting, open to all, to look at how we're doing and what could be bettered, to look at new directions and to strengthen others. We have the basics from our last Parish Assembly in 2019. We need to see what is still relevant to our community here in St Joseph's, so a little more on this before too long.

A simple census form will shortly be available. We look forward to your help in giving us a clearer picture of who we are.
